Fruity Yogurt Parfait

MATERIALS NEEDED

A4 size Clear contact paper (x2 sheets)

Coloured tissue paper

Scissors

Butterfly template (printed on paper to the size you want)



HOW TO MAKE A BUTTERFLY SUNCATCHERS

- 1. **Prepare Your Template:** Start by cutting out the butterfly shape from your printed template. This will be your guide. Don't forget to cut out the centre of the wings too.
- 2. Cut tissue Paper: Choose your favourite colours of tissue paper and cut them into small squares or shapes. These will be the colourful parts of your suncatcher.
- 3. Arrange Your Design: Place the first sheet of contact paper flat on the table, sticky side up. Carefully arrange your tissue paper pieces inside the butterfly wings. Be creative with your design!
- 4. Seal the Suncatcher: Once you're happy with your tissue paper arrangement, place the second sheet on top, sticky side down, to seal everything in.
- 5. Cut the Butterfly: Using scissors, carefully cut around the butterfly shape, leaving a bit of space around the edges to ensure the contact paper stay sealed.
- 6. Display: Your butterfly suncatcher is ready! Hold it up to the light and watch it shine. You can tape it to a window to let the sunlight make it glow.

Enjoy your beautiful butterfly creation!
